Jesus was coming, as saviour of the world,,, which meant that the world needed to know that it **needed** a saviour... And the message of John, was intended to prepare us, for exactly that – To give us, "**knowledge of salvation**" "in the forgiveness of sins"...

that we cannot possibly live without, a certain thing that we've never needed in the past...

But John wasn't interested, in advertising – John wasn't into marketing... – John wasn't attempting to sell us a product, that we didn't need... All John had to do, was give knowledge, where there was none. He gave knowledge, to those who were ignorant.

Well, that's gotta be someone else, hey, because none of us here are "ignorant", are we? (No. Never.) We certainly don't like to **think** of ourselves as "ignorant"... but the fact of the matter is, most people (even in our own community), are totally ignorant of the fact that they need a saviour...

At Christmas time, we can all get together, and sing about the fact that "a saviour is born", but for what purpose??? Unless I know I need a saviour... - who cares???? And **that** was **John's** mission – to inform the world, that they needed a saviour... But more than that.

because of the tender mercy of our God, Jesus, in His coming, would

give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death,....

to guide our feet into the way of peace.

It's almost poetic... It sounds enticing, but what does it mean?

What it means, is without Jesus, I sit in darkness, and the shadow of death... That can't be good.... And no it's not...

Without Jesus, every human being, lives their life, in the shadow of death. No matter how much you manage to achieve in life – whether it be financial, or business, or relationships, or family.... When it all boils down, even our very best achievements, are under the shadow of death...

That's the paradox of life. Our entire life (whether we know it or not), is shadowed by our inevitable death. We all die. Some die younger than others, but we all die...

And what I choose to do with Jesus in **this** life, determines whether death is a dark shadow, or an entrance into the bright light of the presence of God.

The coming of Jesus Christ, is like the rising of the sun, which removes the shadow of death. And that's why, our response to Jesus is so very important. In Jesus, He takes us from that shadow of death, and becomes our light of life...
